

INITIATIVES & IMPACT

ACCESS TO JUSTICE

People rely on the courts and government agencies to solve serious legal problems, find help, and achieve stability. But inequitable practices can make navigating these complex systems impossible – especially for those who cannot afford legal representation. **The consequences can be devastating and life changing.** Denied access to rights and resources, families may be unjustly evicted, lose custody of their children, struggle to escape domestic violence, or become caught in a cycle of debt and poverty.

MA Appleseed is:

- Co-leading the Mass Speaks Coalition to expand language access at critical state agencies.
- Launching a new community-centered research project to break down language barriers in the Massachusetts Trial Court.
- Promoting best practices outlined in our research so unrepresented litigants can navigate the civil justice system.

Highlights

- Mobilized the legal community to secure an unprecedented \$165.5 million investment in the Massachusetts' court system that will modernize court infrastructure and help working families achieve a fair outcome in court.
- → Successfully advocated for the elimination of cell phone bans in all Massachusetts state courts, ensuring no one is turned away from court because they cannot afford an attorney to hold their cell phone for them.
- → Filed a federal discrimination complaint against the child welfare system to demand accountability and stop the wrongful separation of immigrant families caused by language barriers.



EDUCATIONAL JUSTICE

Students who are repeatedly excluded from school through suspensions, expulsions, or school-related arrests become more likely to drop out entirely and face increased risk of coming into contact with the criminal justice system. This is referred to as the school-to-prison pipeline: the policies and practices that funnel students out of their classrooms towards incarceration and which disproportionately impact students of color and students with disabilities.

MA Appleseed is:

- Co-leading coalition efforts to advance policies that disrupt the school-to-prison pipeline, including banning the suspension or expulsion of students based on what they wear to school.
- Combating harmful media narratives to stop the criminalization of students and prevent the rollback of racial justice reforms.
- Supporting movement-building efforts at the local level that build student and community power, reimagine school safety beyond punitive discipline, and ground school environments in restorative justice practices.

Highlights

- → Published community-led research exploring stories from girls of color about the impact of exclusionary discipline on their lives and amplifying the intersection of racial and genderbased discrimination in schools.
- Successfully advocated for the CROWN Act with coalition partners, establishing civil rights protections against natural hairstyle discrimination to prevent the over-policing of Black and brown girls.
- Supported coalition efforts to ensure every K-12 student in Massachusetts has access to free food at school, transforming the lives of an estimated 400,000 children around the Commonwealth.

YOUTH HOMELESSNESS

Unaccompanied youth experiencing homelessness face legal barriers that prevent them from meeting their basic needs, deepen trauma, and trap them in cycles of harm. Our Legal Education, Advocacy, and Protections (LEAP) Project for Youth Experiencing Homelessness aims to build a more robust legal safety net for Massachusetts' most vulnerable young people that assists them on their journey towards stability.



"There are so many legal issues that youth might need to navigate: help with leases, mental health resources, employment issues, education access, and their everyday rights. This is even harder if you're experiencing homelessness."

MA Appleseed is:

- Coordinating know-your-rights trainings for youth experiencing homelessness and the adults who work with them.
- Elevating available resources and connecting with especially vulnerable populations such as LGBTQ+ and transition-age youth.
- Leading the Massachusetts Homeless Youth Legal Network, a group of 40+ attorneys and advocates working to support unaccompanied youth through pro bono resources and policy advocacy.

Highlights

- → Published the Massachusetts Homeless Youth Handbook, a comprehensive, state-specific know-your-rights guide for youth and young adults that answers common legal questions.
- → Advanced legislation to expand the legal rights of underage youth experiencing homelessness so they can access supportive services without parental consent and meet their immediate survival needs.
